Student of the Month Citizenship is a student who demonstrates qualities such as helpfulness, kindness, politeness and makes an effort to follow school and classroom rules as well as shows respect towards teachers and peers

### Perfect Attendance for the Month

Students who have had no absences in the month and less than five lates (5 lates = 1 day absence)



We hope everyone is staying healthy through the cold winter. Please remember that children 8 years old and under who have had a flu shot for the first time this year require a second dose one month after the first to be fully covered. This applies every year. Please book immunizations by phone. Our clinic days are every Tuesday and Wednesday between 10AM and 2PM.

-Infants are due to be immunized at ages 2,4,6,12 and 18 months. Preschool children are due between ages 4 and 6 years.

-Most Grade 5 students have had 2 doses of the required 3 of Hepatitis B and for girls HPV. The nurse will be coming to the school to administer these. If your child has not had any needles in grade 5 please contact the health center. Grade 9 students are eligible for two vaccines also.

-We offer many services at the health centre. We encourage members of the community to come forward to participate in sewing, beading and cooking that is promoted through the health center. Every Tuesday there is something going on in the "community wellness room". Phone ahead if you need more info.
