
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Sunchild School Round Dance and Parent Teacher Interviews

What You Can Do About Bullying!

-What is bullying? Bullying is when someone keeps doing or saying things to have power over another person.

-What can you do if you are being bullied? Coping with bullying can be difficult, but remember, you are not the problem, the bully is. You have a right to feel safe and secure.

- Spend time with your friends! Bullies hardly ever pick on people if they're with others in a group
- Try ignoring the bully, tell them to stop and walk away whenever the bullying starts.
- If someone is bullying you, you should always tell an adult you can trust. This isn't telling tales. You have a right to be safe and adults can do things to get the bullying stopped.
- If you find it difficult to talk about being bullied, you might find it easier to write down what's been happening to you and give it to an adult you trust.
- If you see someone else being bullied you should always try to stop it. If you do nothing, you're saying that bullying is okay.

Are You a Bully?

Have you ever bullied someone else?
Think about why you did it and how you were feeling at the time. If you are sometimes a bully, try to find other ways to make yourself feel good. Most bullies aren't liked, even if it starts out that way. Remember, it's best to treat others the way you would like to be treated.

For the Safety of your child. Please take the time to review the School Bus rules with your child.





- 1. The driver is in full charge of the School bus at all times and students shall obey him/her promptly and respectfully.
- 2. Students are responsible to be on time, on the road at the bus stop, not in the house.
- 3. Unnecessary conversation with the driver is prohibited.
- 4. Classroom conduct is to be observed on the bus and any disturbance, which may take the driver's attention and endanger the safe operation of the bus, is prohibited.
- 5. Smoking is not permitted on the bus.
- 6. Drugs, alcohol and weapons are not allowed on the bus
- 7. Students shall not litter the bus or throw anything out the bus windows.
- 8. Students shall not extend any part of their body out the window.
- 9. Students shall remain seated while the bus is in motion.
- 10. Students shall not destroy, mutilate or damage the bus in any way.
- 11. Students shall leave the bus at their regular stops unless a note from the parent is presented to the driver requesting a drop off at another stop.
- 12. Students shall dress properly for the weather of the day.
- 13. Students shall unload the bus from front to back.
- 14. When leaving the bus, students shall observe the directions of the driver and watch for traffic before crossing the road.


Canadian Metis children's author and literacy advocate who has written more than 50 books in both French and English, spoke this past week to students at Sunchild School. "Do you
