

#### For the Safety of your child. Please take the time to review the School Bus rules with your child.



- 1. The driver is in full charge of the School bus at all times and students shall obey him/her promptly and respectfully.
- 2. Students are responsible to be on time, on the road at the bus stop, not in the house.
- 3. Unnecessary conversation with the driver is prohibited.
- 4. Classroom conduct is to be observed on the bus and any disturbance, which may take the driver's attention and endanger the safe operation of the bus, is prohibited.
- 5. Smoking is not permitted on the bus.
- 6. Drugs, alcohol and weapons are not allowed on the bus.
- 7. Students shall not litter the bus or throw anything out the bus windows.
- 8. Students shall not extend any part of their body out the window.
- 9. Students shall remain seated while the bus is in motion.
- 10. Students shall not destroy, mutilate or damage the bus in any way.
- 11. Students shall leave the bus at their regular stop unless a note from the parent is presented to the driver requesting a drop off at another stop.
- 12. Students shall dress properly for the weather of the day.
- 13. Students shall unload the bus from front to back.
- 14. When leaving the bus, students shall observe the directions of the driver and watch for traffic before crossing the road.


