

**Sunchild School Attendance Policy** 

The Sunchild Attendance Policy is used to determine who receives awards at the end of the school year at the awards assembly, as well as the Student of the Month Awards.

Students in Kindergarten to Grade Six will be marked late if they miss less than 20 minutes of class time. More than 20 minutes it will be counted as an absent. Students from Grades Seven to Twelve will be counted absent if they miss more than 20 minutes of a period; less than 20 minutes and it will be counted as a late.

If a student receives five lates it adds up to be one absent.



Breakfast Available for students from 8:30 to 8:50 Daily . Elementary students are served in their classroom. Jr. Sr. students are served in the school cafeteria.




# **Peanut Free School**

# School Field Trips and Student Incentive Trips

At times field trips will also require specific criteria to participate such as age or academic programing. For the safety of our students we ask that all parents who are dropping off their children at school to keep right and drive around the school parking lot. Please let your child out long the side of the school building (area marked with n circle). Parents then can exit without the need to go around the monument where buses are dropping off students.
