# Sunchild School Attendance Policy



The Sunchild Attendance Policy is used to determine who receives awards at the end of the school year at the awards assembly, as well as the Student of the Month Awards.

Students in Kindergarten to Grade Six will be marked late if they miss less than 30 minutes of class time. More than 30 minutes it will be counted as an absent. Students from Grades Seven to Twelve will be counted absent if they miss more than 20 minutes of a period; less than 20 minutes and it will be counted as a late.

If a student receives five lates it adds up to be one absent.

# **Message from the Director of Education**

Tansi! Metoni miyasin kihtwam ota e-peatoskeyan. Kayas ote e-ki-kiskinohamakeyan. Warm greetings to the communities of Sunchild and O'Chiese. It's wonderful to be back working for your Nations. I taught here in 1989 when the schools were amalgamated.

For those of you who don't know me I am Askiytakiw Piyesiw Iskwew (Blue Thunderbird Woman). My Eurocentric name is Pearleen Lachhab (Baptiste) from the Little Pine First Nation. My mother was late Kate Baptiste (Tootoosis) and my late father was David Baptiste; however, I was raised by my late step father Henry Bear (Askihtakwiniw). I remember traveling to your community as a child. We often visited the O'Chiese family. Jimmy was a very tall and fast runner then. I remember he won the distance races that used to be held during the powwows. We were a traveling family and often came here for ceremony. The Frencheater and Whitford family became friends as well, and I have known Doreen, Theresa and Danita's families for a very long time. My nephew, Rylan Bull has been part of your community for about ten years now. His partner is Crystal Rowan.

I am here with my two sons William and his wife Stacy, and Julien and his baby girl Angeleah, who will start daycare on Tuesday, Sept. 2. I feel blessed to be part of your community. Sometimes we think we are in charge of our lives when we aren't. The Creator has a plan for all of us. I am currently doing my Masters degree in Land Based Indigenous Education from the University of Saskatchewan. I was very pleased to hear strong messages from the Leadership, School Committee and the Principal on the importance of cultural education, language retention and outdoor education. Sunchild School will work toward including these components, which we hope will increase student engagement at Sunchild School. I look forward to meeting all the students, parents and guardians in the communities. Feel free to stop by the office anytime. Ay-hay.
