## Taking Students Home Early?

Parents please ensure that you sign your child out of the school through the main office. We need to know who is in the school in case of fire or related emergency.

#### Attendance and Academic Success



#### Did you know that:

Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.

Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of third grade.

Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school, or about 18 days, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That's just two days a month and that's known as chronic absence.

When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating.

Your child's attendance is used to determine awards at the end of the school year at the awards assembly, as well as each month for our Elementary Student of the Month.

Students in Kindergarten to Grade Six are marked present or absent based on AM and PM attendance. Students are marked late if they have missed less than 20 minutes of class time. More than 20 minutes of missed class time and it is counted as an absent.

On average last year students in elementary grades were absent 56 days out of 176 instructional days. This 11 weeks of school is equivalent to two and half months of missed instructional time.

Student attendance is directly related to academic success.

#### Visitors Are Welcome...


